The opening matchday of the CONMEBOL qualifier saw newcomers Chile having a dream debut against Paraguay and favourites Brazil and Argentina dispatching Uruguay and Venezuela, respectively.

In their first-ever official beach soccer match, the Chilean team showed poise and tactical discipline to comfortably overcome the Peruvians 8-5 and collect their first 3 points in Group A.

A nail-biter that had the two teams struggling to maintain ball possession and to create scoring opportunities, Argentina vs. Venezuela featured the other two teams from group A, whose kick-off had Chile beating Peru 8-5. Federico Hilaire scored the winner for the Argentineans with just over 1 minute left and lifted them to 3 points in the standings.

The seven countries playing the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup 2008 Qualifier CONMEBOL Buenos Aires were drawn into two groups. The top two teams from each of them will qualify for the semi finals, and the two finalists will be the South American representatives in the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup 2008, which will be played from July 17 to 27 in Marseilles, France. Right now, there are five teams that have already secured their berths: France (host country); Senegal and Cameroon (Africa); El Salvador and Mexico (CONCACAF).
